# WHAT WE KNOW:

Now more than ever, we are aware of the challenges and tragic impact mental health injuries have on our Veterans, First Responders and their families. The statistics present a stark reality for our country and and highlight a need for action.

44.5%

Of 5,000 First Responders surveyed, 44.5% screened positive for one or more mental health injuries.

40%

In most police jurisdictions across Ontario, as many as 40% of calls involve persons with mental health issues.



1,600

CAF members released for medical reasons each year.

22%

Ontario has approximately 8,000 paramedics. Studies predict that operational stress injuries affects 22% of our paramedics.

#### REPEATED EXPOSURE

Between 15% to 20% of firefighters suffer from post traumatic stress because of repeated workplace traumatic experiences.

Regional Police in 1990. He
progressed through the ranks and
was promoted to Deputy Chief.
He has worked in a variety of
roles with York Regional Police,
including Uniform Patrol, Criminal
Investigations, Investigative
Services, Traffic, Marine, Public
Order, and as the Deputy Chief
of the Administration Branch,
the Operations Branch and
Investigations and Support Branch.

Commissioner Carrique has received the Police Exemplary Service Medal, the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal and, in 2013 he was appointed as a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces. Commissioner Carrique is also a Serving Brother of the Order and present Chair of St. John Ambulance - York Region Branch.
